From the Desk of Session

As we turn the calendar page from November to December, most of us immediately go to December 25 – the day of our Lord's birth. In the church calendar, Christmas is celebrated on that day and that day alone. Preceding Christmas is Advent. "Advent" means "coming" or "arrival." During the season of Advent, we celebrate Christ's coming into the world and watch with expectant hope for his coming again. In its historical origins, the season of Advent was patterned after the season of Lent, a six-week period of penitence and preparation for Easter. Similarly, the four weeks of Advent present an opportunity for communal discernment and personal examination, as the church prepares to celebrate the Nativity of the Lord and looks with hope for Christ's return.

PC-USA's provided resources for the 2022 season of Advent focus on the Gospel of Mark. The Gospel of Mark?!? Where's the Baby Jesus? Where's the warm and comforting Christmas story we remember? Mark's gospel at Christmas is like bringing the box labelled "Nativity" out of the attic and finding it empty – no Magi, no camels, no Mary and Joseph, and no Baby Jesus. Mark picks up the story of Jesus at his baptism. It then embarks on an accounting of Jesus's ministry that can be described in one word – disruptive. Jesus challenges his followers (and us) to not accept the status quo. We are instructed to restore the afflicted, the tormented, and the grieving while being reminded that healing has come in Christ. We long for the beating of swords into plowshares, yet we rejoice that the Prince of Peace has appeared. We yearn for the barren deserts of our inner cities to flourish, yet we laud the desert Rose that has bloomed. We dream of the land where lions and lambs live in harmony, yet we acclaim the child born to lead us into the promised land.

Yes, Mark probably has no business in recounting and celebrating Christmas. Mark is instructive during Advent; however. Its chapters discuss the coming of Christ into our lives and world. While Mark's Gospel does not give us a conventional cozy Christmas message, it does help us to discover a fresh understanding of the holiness of Christmas – the holiness when God's transformative love is born in us.



Christmas Maze





Print out this Christmas ornament to color and make!

Christmas Ornament


1. Cut out the three pieces and fold each in half. The left half is A, the right half is B.

2. Glue the back of "2B" to the back of "3A."
3. Glue the back of "3B" to the back of "1A."



A Christmas Story for Children




JUST A LITTLE DONKEY,
